We are delighted to report that both RA candidates were elected in the recent local elections for Elmbridge Borough Council (EBC).

Councillor Caroline James (TDWGRA) was re-elected, with an increased majority, for a further term for the Thames Ditton ward and James Crawshaw (HWRA) was elected for the Hinchley Wood and Weston Green Ward. The voting figures were:

Hinchley Wood and Weston Green

Conservative	347

Turnout in both wards was amongst the highest in the borough at just over 41%. The good turnout and strong support for our RA candidates shows that in this corner of Elmbridge the majority of people strongly believe in our message of 'local politics for local people.'

Planning

Alexpo's appeal against EBC's refusal of planning permission for a massive development at the **Jolly Boatman** site (**2018/3810**) is due to start on June 14 and is scheduled over four days.

The RA has made a significant donation towards the production of high-quality visual representations of the impact such a development would have on the unique Hampton Court Palace and surrounding areas to help the case against it.

The planning inspector has dismissed the appeal against the refusal of planning consent for **Bransby Lodge**, **St Leonards Road (2020/0865).** The dismissal agreed with all the points raised at the East Area Planning Committee. Our thanks to local RA councillors Karen Randolph and Caroline James for their detailed examination of the application.

Changes have been made to the **Aldi** (**2021/3857**) application involving a change to the flood risk assessment, and the addition of a new crossing point, so the consultation has re-opened. No committee date has been set.

Albany Reach

Albany Reach has seen an increase in visitors enjoying the green space next to the river. Local resident Nell Hickman, who has done so much to co-ordinate volunteer litter pickers there, is now looking at what can be done to make sure the area is as safe as possible for users. She said: "With so many people spending time by the river we want to see what safety equipment we have or may need just in case."

The Local Plan Consultation -Deciding the future of Elmbridge for the next 15 years

The Regulation 19 public consultation stage of the Draft Local Plan is due to start on June 19. The Local Plan is an important document as it sets out the Council's vision for Elmbridge for the next 15 years.

As your Councillors we all support the policies included in it, but it has to go through public consultation and then to the public inquiry stage.

We don't expect an easy ride with the inspector as we are challenging the Government's housing target in order to resist developing our Green Belt. However, there was encouraging news from the Department for Housing and Levelling Up recently, which stated: 'areas that are constrained by Green Belt land or Areas of Natural Beauty will no longer be expected to reach unrealistic (housing targets) if they can produce a Plan that is well evidenced and drawn up in good faith' This could be good news for Elmbridge as we embark on the final consultation with residents and it will help our case if we have vocal support from the community.

We urge everyone to engage with the consultation and do contact us if you have any queries about anything in it. And please make your views known to the Council when you have decided what you think about it.

Grass verges

Elmbridge Borough Council has been cutting our highways grass verges since 2008 on behalf of Surrey County Council (SCC). As of 2022, SCC has resumed responsibility for cutting grass verges. Their policy is four cuts per year. SCC has a web page devoted to grass cutting where you can report issues and apply for a license if you want to maintain a verge yourself.

Some questions answered

When we've been out and about talking to people about the local government election it's clear there is a lot of confusion about what goes on, so here's a few Q&As to explain things for those who don't know. (more will be in the Autumn edition).

Why do we have seem to have elections every year?

Elmbridge Borough Council follows a four year cycle, with Councillors elected for a four year term. To ensure continuity and minimise disruption, Councillors are elected 1/3 at a time (i.e 16 Councillors) in years 1, 2 and 3. Then in year 4 there is a year's respite with no EBC election.

Surrey County Council also runs on a four year cycle, but they elect all 81 Councillors in one go. We elected our Surrey Councillors last year (Residents' Councillor Nick Darby won The Dittons ward) so there won't be another SCC election until 2025.

General Elections (the big one) can be called a maximum of five years after the last one (December 2019). It's anyone's guess when the next one will be! What is the difference between Surrey County Council (SCC) and Elmbridge Borough Council (EBC)?

Surrey County Council is our primary tier authority. Their key responsibilities are Surrey-wide and include: Education; Social care, Fire Services, Highways, Transport, Libraries, Recreation and museums

SCC has 81 Councillors and is Conservative led - 47 Conservative; 16 Residents - 14 Lib Dem, 2 Labour, 2 Green.

Elmbridge Borough Council is one of 11 boroughs in Surrey. It includes the towns of Walton, Weybridge, Cobham, Esher and E & W Molesey. EBC is primarily responsible for: Planning, Housing, Environmental health. Waste and Refuse collection, Licensing; Community Support services (eg Meals on Wheels, Community Transport, Community Centres), Leisure and Culture (council-run sports facilities, arts etc), 1850 hectares of green spaces, including 57 parks, 20 countryside sites and common land, and collecting our Council Tax

Update from Nick Darby, Surrey County Councillor



Highways is a hot topic, so I will start there. The County Council has replaced main Highways contractor Keir with Ringway. Time will tell, but my first experience was helpful. I reported various potholes in a road in Weston Green and the work was done the next day. Let's hope Ringway keep that up.

Residents can report highway issues direct to Surrey Highways. Anyone who prefers can email me and I will pass it on. Potholes which "qualify" should be repaired within five working days.

I await confirmation from Highways Officers on how far "my" Highway repair allocation will stretch. As usual the dilemma remains what to choose from a long list. I hope that a continuing study into local cycling and walking routes will produce results all over the Dittons. Some joined up thinking to cover Portsmouth Road, Hampton Court Way, the area between Long Ditton and Hinchley Wood would not go amiss.

Surrey currently spend about £44m a year on Home to School Transport. The Surrey Cabinet is intent on making changes to save money. It is essential that anything like this is covered fairly, with plenty of notice to those who may be affected. Some consultation has taken place. However, if any resident is aware of issues which may affect their family, please get in touch so I can raise this. I sit on the School Transport Appeals Committee

I will finish with the difficulties we face with Adult Social Care. Government has announced a cap on care costs, and an ability for those who self-fund to request

their local authority (e.g. Surrey) to arrange their care. In theory that should be cheaper.

Part of this "package" is the National Insurance increase which has just come in.

The difficulty is how counties like Surrey are funded by Central Government to cover the extra costs, which may in the worst case, amount to hundreds of millions. Much detail has still to be finalised. Surrey and others will no doubt press hard for a funding formula fairer than that which already exists. It is problematic, with serious implications for Council Tax in the future.

As always, if anyone has a query please get in touch. May I wish all a good, warm, safe and healthy summer, and that you have found time to celebrate the Jubilee, more than 70 years of outstanding public service by the truly exceptional person who is our Queen.

I'm Nicola Andrews - resident of Thames Ditton and also Palaces Director for Historic Royal Palaces. Historic Royal Palaces looks after six of the most iconic buildings in the UK: the Tower of London, the State Apartments at Kensington Palace, Banqueting House on Whitehall, Kew Palace, Hillsborough Castle in Northern Ireland and, of course, our very own Hampton Court Palace!

The Palaces, gardens and parks look amazing. They are grand and beautiful, and we do our utmost to present them at their best. But there is a lot that visitors don't see, and I'm going to share some of that with you here.

Hampton Court Palace is a building of

two halves: the Tudor Palace built in the sixteenth century for Cardinal Wolsey, only to be taken from him and further enhanced by Henry VIII; and the Baroque Palace designed and built in the seventeenth century by Christopher Wren for King William and Queen Mary.

The most important rooms are on public display and you can wander through the State Apartments in the footsteps of Kings and Queens. But behind the scenes is a warren of 1000 other rooms of all shapes and sizes. Many are now offices or other spaces let for commercial use. However, others have been left untouched for decades, now acting as an important reminder of the people that have come before us.

A grace-and-favour apartment bathroom

In the mid eighteenth century, the Palace ceased to be used as a royal residence and much of it was sub divided into apartments for grace-and-favour residents: people who were offered free accommodation in return for services to the monarch or nation, or more often than not, to their dependents. My office, Apartment 44, was once home to Scott of the Antarctic's mother, and to Ernest Shackleton's wife (not at the same time!).

The average size of a grace-and-favour apartment was 12 to 14 rooms, and at its peak there were around 50 apartments in total. Despite the grand location, the living conditions were not great. In 1857, Charles Dickens described in Little Dorrit how the residents at Hampton Court Palace lived in *'the most primitive manner'*.

We no longer have any grace-and-favour residents living with us, but there are a range of apartments and signposts left untouched that serve as a reminder of that important time in the Palace's history. They also provide us with a fascinating insight in to changing tastes in interior décor, as a couple of photographs show.

Also housed at Hampton Court Palace is the Royal Ceremonial Dress Collection. It contains 10,000 items of historic dress from the 16th century to the present day, providing information about the history of fashion, life at court, and the lives of key historical figures.

The treasures range from the Bristowe Hat, said to have been hurled in the air in triumph by Henry VIII when he captured Boulogne, and still dazzlingly well preserved after more than 450 years, to the Travolta dress, worn by Princess Diana when she danced with John Travolta at a gala dinner at the White House in 1985.

Not everything stored at Hampton Court is quite so glamorous. We also have rooms filled with the more day-to-day items used by residents and staff, such as suitcases to firemen's hats, and fabric from the building, including old doors, ironwork and stonework. All represent important stories from the Palace's past.

At Historic Royal Palaces we care for all of these things, alongside the gardens, parks, buildings and other precious collections in our care. As a charity, our role is to take off the taxpayers' shoulders the burden of caring for these important places, to ensure they are in ever better condition for future generations to enjoy, and to deliver public access and benefit through them. That's something we feel passionately about and we work hard to generate the income needed to achieve it (we receive no public funding support).

The last two years have been tough for our organisation. In 2020 we lost £100m in income and all our £40m reserves. We finished the year with nothing, but managed to secure a £40m loan which has kept us going. Of the 5 million visitors we welcomed each year pre-pandemic, 3 million went to the Tower of London and 70% were from overseas. Most of our income was generated by the Tower, with sites such as Hampton Court operating at a loss. The overseas market has been significantly impacted and will take several years to grow back. We have had to halve our staffing and other operating costs and stop nearly all projects. We are seeing shoots of recovery, however. In 2021/22 we welcomed 1.5m visitors across our sites and we only lost £11m (we were expecting to lose nearer £32m!).

We have a long road to recovery ahead of us and have had to make many changes to the way we operate in order to keep the

organisation going. We are grateful for the support that so many of you have offered us and would like to take this opportunity to thank you.

There is much to look forward to in the year ahead. We will be celebrating the Jubilee with a '*Superbloom*' event at the Tower of London. The moat has been sown with over 20 million seeds which will develop and morph through a spectacular display of wildflowers between June and

September. Visitors will be able enter the moat to experience the colours, scents and sounds close up.

The seeds have also been sown on the West Front of Hampton Court Palace for all to enjoy as they pass by. There is a Jubilee Joust at Hampton Court in the first week of June, and at Kensington Palace we have our Life Through A Royal Lens exhibition, which brings together some of the most iconic images ever taken of the Royal Family.

Of course the regular favourites also return to Hampton Court this year, in the form of the Music Festival, Garden Festival, Food Festival and Festive Fayre. More information is available on the website at *www.hrp.org.uk*

Ferry Works – still in the business of innovation and invention

Have you ever wondered what goes on these days inside the mellow and dignified walls of Ferry Works?

Sitting serenely beside the River Thames, it is an important monument not only to the industrial revolution, but also to the vision and enthusiasm of local residents who passionately believed that Thames Ditton should be a great place to live and work – and not simply become a sleepy 'dormitory' of London.

Ferry Works has a history of innovation and invention going back over two hundred years. Willans and Robinson were the first builders, and made their revolutionary steam engine here. Then AC Cars moved in with their 'Amazing Cars' and made motorised transport affordable. After WWII came Rola Celestion, makers of top quality loudspeakers favoured by rock and roll groups of the 60s.

In the late 1970s, just as the pigeons started to enjoy their vacant luxury riverside aviary, Octagon Developments, a local property development company, stepped in and applied for residential development. Persuasive arguments from residents led to a meeting of minds, and Octagon commissioned local Hungarian architect Katharina Halasz to restore its Victorian features as well as modernising, and return the site to a place of work once more.

Today the Ferry Works continues to breed innovation. For example, NCMT provide computerised precision machine tool solutions to UK manufacturers as diverse as makers of replacement knee joints and Rolls Royce aeroplane turbine blades. They were one of the first companies to bring Japanese machine tool technology to Britain.
Havas Life Medicom are a healthcare communications agency that integrates strategy, creativity, marketing and PR in one business. They creatively use data and psychology to help clients develop meaningful communications with their audiences about medicine and its role in improving health.

Then, there is the work of award-winning architects PRP, who specialise in designing later living environments. Clare Cameron, PRP Director, said: "Our reputation for reinventing best practice earned us a place on an expert panel for innovation in 2009, advising government departments on recommendations for housing the UK's ageing population. Known as 'HAPPI', this has become a firm base for further government initiatives in this area, and we continue to win in the 'HAPPI' category of the prestigious annual Housing Design Awards."

Its current occupants are committed to retaining the heritage of the building by sensitively incorporating this into their office refurbishments. For example, the meeting rooms of Havas Life Medicom carry the names of famous AC Cars such as 'Cobra' and 'Ace'; and PRP have stripped

bare their ceilings to reveal steel structures and insulated ventilation shafts to give the interior an industrial but contemporary feel.

As one of its earliest occupiers, NCMT built their suite of offices around the majesty of the original Victorian machine shop, with its floor to ceiling arched windows overlooking the river and tall steel girders, to provide an impressive showroom filled with precision machines.

Jonathan Smart, Managing Director said: "After 40 years we are soon vacating the premises as the machine shop no longer meets our practical needs, but I shall really miss the village, our riverside location and working in a building with such an illustrious engineering legacy'.



PRP Offices

Ferry Works is the workplace of several hundred employees - a mix of locals and those who commute, using public transport, or their car, as parking is provided as part of a deal with Colets Health Club.

Uniformly, people said that they love the riverside setting and are regular users of the village amenities – particularly those providing food and drink. However, following the Covid19 pandemic, businesses have moved to a hybrid style of working where people combine working from home and office and this has resulted in halving the numbers of employees on the site at any one time. To encourage staff to return to the office, Havas Life Medicom has adapted its environment to provide river-view sofa areas for casual meetings and trendy soundproofed booths for quieter conversations between home and office based staff. Communications Manager, Smitha Kusumakar said: "Not many workplaces can enjoy their own private seating area on the banks of the river Thames or sit in the peaceful garden of a 12th century church during their lunchbreak."

The move of its 40-year occupant NCMT, combined with a change to flexible working practices is likely to herald a new era for Ferry Works and the village, but with a heritage of innovation and adaptability, we can hope to look forward to a new chapter of reinvention.

On March 29, Chairman Graham Cooke welcomed attendees to the first 'in person' AGM for three years – a special welcome was extended to Nicola Andrews who, following the formal business, gave an outstanding presentation about Historic Royal Parks.

Graham highlighted the success at the 2021 elections with 100% RA representation in both Thames Ditton and Hinchley Wood and Weston Green wards – attendees were urged to use their vote on May 5 and support the respective RAs.

Graham thanked all Councillors for their efforts over the year including Surrey County Cllr Nick Darby who continues in his role which includes being Leader of the Opposition on Surrey County Council.

Secret Gardens of Thames Ditton had been a great success, with over 250 attendees. This year, we look forward to another Secret Gardens of Weston Green on June 26.

Support continues to be provided for Christmas lights and we have also been able to provide both financial and physical support to many other local projects including bulb planting, litter picking, the popular Farmers' Market and the Elmbridge Food Bank.

Last summer saw the installation of two new benches by Milbourne Pond which was funded jointly with the Milbourne Pond Appeal Fund. We also gave financial support to our Flooding Sub Committee group who have been successful in obtaining additional funding from Elmbridge for survey work on the area close to the Albany, this is an ongoing project and thanks go to all those involved.

We continue to communicate with all in the community via our magazine Thames Ditton Today, our website and via Twitter. We need more advertisers.

During the year we have taken part in a number of consultations including South Western Railway's proposal to reduce services. We have lobbied to maintain all forms of public transport.
